1. What is Group Home

- A group home is a private <u>residence</u> for individuals who cannot live with their families, or people with chronic disabilities. Typically there are no more than six residents and there is a trained caregiver there twenty-four hours a day.
- In generic sense, also known as:
 - Resident Care Home
 - ✓ Foster Home
 - Community Providers
 - Residential Care Facility
 - ✓ Intermediate Care Facility (ICF)
 - Devopmental Disability Service Organization (DDSO)



- Group Homes may serve behavior health, mental health, developmental Disability, Troubled teens, senior/aged houses. Some organizations serve mixture, some only behavioral.

Example: Skills – 19 houses, 12 of which have non-ambulatory people


